

Wabtec Receives Order Worth \$95 Million For MPXpress® Commuter Locomotives

WILMERDING, PA, April 21, 2008 – Wabtec Corporation (NYSE: WAB) said its MotivePower subsidiary has received an order worth \$95 million for 26 MPXpress® commuter locomotives from the Maryland Transit Administration for its MARC commuter rail service. The locomotives, to be built in Boise, Idaho, will be delivered in 2008-09.

“We have a strong backlog of locomotive projects, and this order demonstrates our important role in the commuter rail marketplace,” said Albert J. Neupaver, Wabtec’s president and chief executive officer.
