1 GENERAL

- Suppliers of products and/or services to be used in relation to a transport system whether direct or indirect have a responsibility to provide safe products and/or services. Any failing in the product being supplied or the task being performed shall not affect the health or safety of persons on a transport system.
- Wabtec Rail Limited (WRL) have assessed the products and/or services you are supplying and where the product is deemed as safety critical, measures are required to be undertaken to ensure that they import no risk to the UK railway infrastructure. Products/Services that fall in to this category shall be identified on the Purchase Order as QA1 or QA2.
